# Collective Worship is the building blocks of each day.

- We ensure that collective worship takes many different forms. It is led by Members of the church community, Rector, children and all staff.
- Each assembly is opened by the lighting of a candle and saying of a prayer. It is closed by the extinguishing of the candle.
- Children regularly share their work with children and parents in celebration assemblies.
- Class assemblies give children a chance to ask and discuss their own beliefs in a more personal setting.

We make Christingles with members of the local community who come into school. Our Christingle service is held in the local church. We raised over £200 for the Children's Society.

# Harvest and the Devizes food bank

- Each year we take food to the church as part of our Harvest Festival. Children from the School Council went to the food bank to find out where our food went and then shared what they had learnt as part of an assembly.
- It is vitally important that children understand what they are doing and why. This makes these celebrations meaningful.

# Supporting our children in their Christian lives.

- During the Harvest Festival in church all children in year 3 are given a Bible to use at their time in Urchfont. This is used regularly in RE lessons so children become familiar with it and understand its importance to Christians.
- They are then presented with these Bibles at the year 6 leaver's service to take with them as they leave the school to enable them to continue their journey as Christians.

# Areas of Reflection

- Christian values impact on all learners and enable them to flourish as individuals.



Areas of reflection give children an opportunity to ask questions and develop their own thinking. Everyone's questions are all valued and given time to be answered in class assemblies.

Diaries of Reflection are being introduced within KS2 to give children another opportunity to develop their own beliefs.



# Parents are an integral and valued part of their children's learning.

We encourage parents to come and share in the children's learning both at home and at school. We invite all parents into our class celebration assemblies and to stay at the end for children to show their work to their parents. It gives our school community a sense of shared experience where all are involved and valued.

- In the last few years we have raised over £1000 to help the CMS Basic School in Juba. We have done this through a range of fundraising activities. The children have also had an opportunity to learn about Sudan. We have shared our learning with the local community by holding Community Tea Parties. These have also been successful in raising money for the Sudanese school we support.
- These links we have made through both the local community and a foreign community have given the children a sense of social responsibility. They have understood the importance of helping others and learning from other cultures. It was also lovely to watch children sharing their knowledge with others from their community.

- The whole school spent time in our garden getting it ready for the coming year. A National Trust representative worked with children to help dig in a new pond. All children had an opportunity to plant a seed for our raised beds.

Our RE was linked to our topic in on light but also gave children a better understanding of the Christingle service they participate in.


# Passover Year 3/4
